For the purpose of continuous academic improvement, Makassed KSPS started adopting Cambridge International Examination, a part of the University of Cambridge, for the English language for grades 2 and 6 This Assessment aims at raising the English Language standards at school to meet the same international standards and to improve students' abilities in English language. This opportunity will help our learners upgrade their potentials, skills, and thereafter career opportunities.

Success in Cambridge English exams provides our students with an internationally recognized certificate issued by Cambridge showing the level they have attained in English.

Accordingly, a debriefing was provided to parents for introducing this new type of assessment and well as teachers' training session provided by a Cambridge representative from the British Council.
